Dorian Van Horn is the Senior Vice President for Investigative Operations at SIGMA. In this role, she evaluates threats, manages disturbing behavior to prevent violence and provides threat assessment consultation and training to businesses, educational institutions, government agencies, foundations, and high-profile individuals. She is FETI trained and an Educational Instructor for Trauma-Informed Sexual Assault Investigations and Adjudication with the National Center for Campus Public Safety (NCCPS), Educational Program, DOJ. She was a member of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals (ATAP) Certification and Development team for the Certified Threat Manager (CTM) Examination. Before joining the private sector, Ms. Van Horn served over 25 years as a Special Agent with the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS). She was the Division Chief/Program Manager for the Threat Management Unit/Insider Threat (TMU/InT). Her responsibilities included overseeing investigations, writing policy for the investigative manual, developing agency wide training, standards, budgeting, and protocols for the unit. Ms. Van Horn also served as the Division Chief for Family & Sexual Violence (F&SV). As the program manager she was responsible for over 3,100 F&SV investigations annually, which was considered the most visible program within NCIS. As the Supervisory Special Agent for Violent Crime, she oversaw reactive criminal investigations programs covering world-wide felony investigations for Violent Crime, Death, Cold Case Homicide, and Special Interest Investigations. She was appointed by the Secretary of Defense as a Government Advisor to the Defense Science Board (DSB) Task Force on Predicting Violent Behavior. She contributed to the DoD report identifying lessons learned from the Ft. Hood attack which set forth effective strategies and cost analysis for preventing insider threat, suicide, assault, domestic violence, and workplace violence throughout the DoD. She was appointed as Chairman for the Internal Threats/Violent Behavior portion of the Togo West-Vernon Clark Report: "DoD Independent Review of Ft. Hood". Recently Ms. Van Horn was appointed as an advisor to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) National Threat Evaluation and Reporting (NTER) Program. In this role she will assist in the development of an updated training program that incorporates a behavioral assessment-based review in reporting and evaluation of tips and leads throughout the country. Additionally, she was appointed as an Advisor, Violence/Threat Assessment Advisory Work Group, National Suicide Prevention Lifeline to assist in the development of standards for violence assessments to the National Suicide Helpline which operates under the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). She is the National Secretary for the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals (ATAP) and former president of the ATAP DC Chapter. Ms. Van Horn is a graduate of West Chester University and is currently enrolled at Catholic University of America, Master of Science in Emergency Services Administration (MS-ESA) program. She was awarded the Wal-Mart-WIFLE (Women in Federal Law Enforcement) Leadership Award and the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals (ATAP) Meritorious Service Award.
